You've Been Framed

Provide a fun way to use a ten frame to visualize number pairs that equal ten.

2 – 4 Players Materials:

One die

Counters (dried pasta, cereal, beans, or paper clips, etc)

Ten Frame (tool used in school)

<u> </u>				

How to Play:

- 1. Each player draws ten-frame (see above).
- 2. Each player selects 10 counters.
- 3. Player one rolls a die and takes that number of counters and puts them on the ten-frame. Then shares what is needed still to make ten.
- 4. Player two repeats.
- 5. Player one goes and if he rolls what is needed to make a ten then he has been "framed". If he rolls over or under, he has to pass.
- 6. Player two repeats.
- 7. Winner is the person to complete his ten-frame.

Variation

- Play with more than 2 players.
- Use more than one ten-frame.
- Determining how many more to make 20.
